

Zen Honeycutt Bio, Overview of Moms Across America and Talks



Zen Honeycutt, OC mother of three boys, is a speaker, consultant, founder and director of Moms Across America; a national coalition of Unstoppable Moms. Their motto is "Empowered Moms, Healthy Kids". Moms Across America's mission is to empower millions to educate themselves about GMOs, get them labeled (as a first step to elimination) and offer GMO free and organic solutions. American moms see their children's health greatly improve when they eliminate GMOs and toxic chemicals from their diet and they want the world to know.

Zen's talk is not just about the dangers of GMOs and glyphosate but about the power of mothers and a growing movement to protect their children.

Moms Across America was created in 2013 with the partnership of the non profit CA Grange Foundation and hundreds of supporters. The all volunteer organization grew from zero in February 2013 to a reach on Facebook of over 300,000 a week by June 2013, in just 4 months. This movement of mothers is growing daily. Nationwide, for their first event 172 groups of MAA Moms and supporters took on leadership, creativity and empowering their community by marching in 4th of July Parades in 44 states in 2013 with floats, decorated bikes and banners that read "Moms Across America March to Label GMOs". Home towns all across the USA cheered our right to know what is in our food, and are continuing to cause GMO awareness to be a mainstream concept for the health and freedom of America.

Moms Across America reached millions of people in person on a single day in the Independence Day Parades in 2013, 2014 and 2015, and tens of millions more through media. 120 media outlets published their press release and mainstream Fox News covered Moms Across America and GMOs in 2013 a groundbreaking 10 minute piece. The reporter was a Mom. Over 700 leaders and volunteers have caused events and support hundreds of thousands of mothers in all 50 states since their first event.

The reason for the effectiveness of this movement is the focus of amplifying the voice of the moms. Mothers buy 85% of the food, and universally are trusted with the care of our children and nation's future. They operate from love, not for concern of corporate profit, and they are not afraid to take on anyone who may bring harm to their child.

In Zen's talk she will cover the importance of integrity in our food labeling and ingredients for the care of our children. She will cover the dangers of GMOs and

glyphosate (Roundup) and the impact on American children. She will cover the bold actions by her organization and mothers, to citizen test glyphosate for the first time in water, urine and breast milk, of which the results are on course to contribute changing EPA policy and the future of farming. When MAA moms spoke up and over 10,000 called the EPA in three days, the EPA listened and met with them. When Zen Honeycutt spoke to thousands at the shareholder meetings of Monsanto, Dow, Dupont and met with Syngenta, the Wall Street Journal quoted her demands from the mothers. When she spoke in China, Australia and New Zealand, she heard similar increases of harm in other countries that allow GMOs and glyphosate. The testimonials she has to share from mothers who have gotten better when they get off GMOs and toxic chemicals, may very well change the course of any country's policy on GMOs and glyphosate and alter their future. She intends to protect children and bring her message to any country who will listen.

Zen Honeycutt has been interviewed by and seen on CNN's C-Span, the Dr.Oz show, was seen by over a billion people seen on the "Larry King of China" Mr. Cui's Talk Show documentary on GMOs in China, and is featured in the documentary "Bought" by Jeffrey Hays. She is an inspiring speaker who is also writing a book called "Unstoppable Love: Empowering Community Leaders to be Global Game Changers." Her organization has expanded to Moms Across the World, co-created with Vandana Shiva and many international moms.
